PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS AND PARTNERS ON INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION: ASIA AND THE PACIFIC REGION

Background

Asia and the Pacific plays a vital role in global tourism, both as an inbound and an outbound market. Total arrivals in the region grew by a steady 6% in 2017, in line with the preceding year, to reach a total 323 million. The region's market share of arrivals has gradually increased from 16% in 2000 to 24% in 2017 (UNWTO, 2018).

To date, the Philippines have forged a total of 14 bilateral tourism cooperation with its partner countries in the Asia and the Pacific Region, 4 of which have an existing Implementation Program namely: Cambodia, People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea and Thailand. In its continuous pursuit to boost the existing robust and strong friendly diplomatic relations with its bilateral, multilateral and regional partners, the Philippines will be able to strengthen its partnership with other countries through identifying matters of mutual interest that may be of cooperation, as well as strengths that the Philippines may acquire from its partner countries. This will likewise enable the country to implement projects and programs focusing on the following areas: tourism development planning, marketing and promotions, standards and regulations, human resource development, and tourism investments.

Objective

In 2019, the Office of Tourism Development Planning, Research and Information Management (OTDPRIM) have developed the Comparative Study on International Tourism Cooperation which serves as a guideline in terms of identifying the Philippines' potential partners in the international community to pursue a high-level bilateral engagement. As a follow through, the OTDPRIM will develop a Study on Priority Development Areas and Partners on International Cooperation focusing on the geographical regions, namely: ASEAN Region, Asia and the Pacific, Europe, Africa, America and Middle East.

This study shall serve as a reference of the Department comprising of the following information:

SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) Analysis;
Crisis management and recovery plans (Disasters, pandemics, etc.)
Protocols implemented in ensuring health and safety of tourists in Asia and the Pacific Region;
Region's existing tourism products and services;
Priority development areas of tourism in Asia and the Pacific Region; and
Potential area of tourism cooperation that the Philippines may benefit.

Project Design

This study aims to:

Serve as a handbook, guideline or manual that consists of information and data regarding the tourism in the Asia and the Pacific region; and

Provide information on the existing tourism products, services, facilities, infrastructure, accessibility and investment in the Asia and the Pacific region.

Scope of Services

The DOT is requesting for a services of a consultant to develop the Study on Priority Development Areas and Partners on International Cooperation: Asia and the Pacific Region:

The consultant shall undertake the following tasks:

Conduct researches on tourism plans and policies, best practices and strategies, marketing and promotions of the ASEAN Member States, as well as strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of the region that can be reflected in the manual;

Conduct discussion with relevant government agencies (to be identified), research institutions and tourism stakeholders;

Develop a questionnaire for the ASEAN Member States containing questions that are applicable for the study;

Analyze and evaluate the information provided by the respective interviewees mentioned in letter b;

Provide a design / layout for the printing of the study; and

Develop the Study on Priority Development Areas and Partners on International Cooperation: ASEAN Region; and

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Eligibility Requirements

Registration Certificate from Security and Exchange Commission (SEC), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) for sole proprietorship, or CDA for cooperatives.

Mayor's/Business Permit issued by the city or municipality where the principal place of business of the prospective bidder is located, or the equivalent document for Exclusive Economic Zone Area,
