Adopt A DOTree: Stewards for the environment



In a meaningful celebration of the Department of Tourism's (DOT) 50th Founding Anniversary, close to 200 employees joined the officials led by Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco for a tree planting activity at Mount Purro Nature Reserve in Antipolo City last May 10.

The nature reserve is a product of a 35-year environmental quest of Toto Malvar and his family, with the help of the Dumagat Indigenous People, to transform an important land area of the Upper Marikina Watershed into the well-loved ecotourism site that it is known today. It started as a grassroots strategy for reforestation and watershed rehabilitation after the chunk of land was damaged by strong typhoons and heavy rainfall which hit Metro Manila for the past decades.

In her speech, the tourism chief expressed her utmost respect and admiration to the efforts made to the beautiful nature reserve, citing that the area reminded her of the mountain barangays of Liloan town in Cebu where she served as a local chief executive for three terms prior to assuming the role as tourism secretary just last year.

"I am the one who's very honored to meet our Dumagat community, Sir Toto, and to all of you here who have worked so hard these past 35 years to build such an inspiring Mountain Reserve. Papunta palang ako dito, I was feeling very nostalgic already because one year ago today, I was actually elected for the third time as mayor of Liloan, and that as I was approaching the mountains of this beautiful City of Antipolo, it really reminded me of my mountain barangays in Liloan. Being here reminds me of that which is most important in all of the things that we do in government, and that is to be stewards for the environment, so that this and the next generation can enjoy the blessings that we have all had the privilege of enjoying our entire lives," she said.

Secretary Frasco then emphasized the importance of caring for the environment by starting with the basics—such as planting a tree.

"While the environment is chiefly within the mandate of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, it is deeply intertwined with our mandate in the Department of Tourism because our purpose is not only to bring in the hordes of tourists both from our international as well as our local destinations, but also to ensure that we inspire and we encourage our tourists to always leave the place better than when they found it."

"And what better way to send out that most important message than to start within ourselves to remember the value of going back to basics—planting a tree—caring for that and adopting a mindset that we are all responsible for the longevity of our tourism destinations," she said.

Thanking the officials and employees who participated in the celebration, she likewise noted that the roles of officials and employees were not just confined to the corners of the office but how the actual work was translated on a nationwide scale.

"You all play a very important role in the life of tourism in the Philippines. Never think that your role is confined to the confines of your office because the impact of the work that each and every single person does in the Department of Tourism is nationwide. So, I urge you that in everything that you do, always make sure that you do it with love, love of our country, love for the Filipino people, and love for yourselves and your families, because we're doing important work here," she said.

Secretary Frasco concluded her speech by manifesting the unequivocal support to such initiatives that would put a premium on tourism in the Philippines, thereby becoming "stewards for the environment."

"And the trees that we are planting today, we are contributing to the good work that Sir Toto and the Dumagat community had safeguarded all these many decades. They truly are an example to be emulated. You can rest assured of my and the Department of Tourism's unequivocal support to bring in more tourists and to educate them through you all the importance of being stewards for the environment," she said. **DOT**

In the opening quarter, DOT got off to a flying start, scoring a whopping 15 points against TPB's measly six.

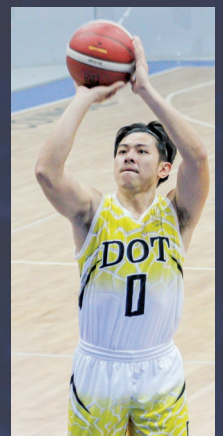

TPB made a valiant effort to play catch-up in the final quarter but was no match for DOT's offensive gameplay before finally surrendering the title.

In an earlier match, the National Parks Development Committee (NPDC) secured third place after narrowly defeating the Philippine Retirement Authority - PRA.

The Inaugural Champions

The Department of Tourism (DOT) emerged as the overall champions of the inaugural Secretary's Cup 2023, personally bestowed by Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco at the Quirino Grandstand, Manila, at the sidelines of the Tourism Run last May 7.

The DOT sports team finished first across all the sports events with 270 big points, while the TIEZA - Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority finished as the 1st runner-up with 250 points, followed by the Philippine Retirement Authority - PRA (PRA) as the 2nd runner-up with 220.

With the DOT family sports tournament staging nine events for a total of 15 titles, the Gold and White flaunted their skills by ruling four tournaments to capture their first Secretary's Cup general title.

This season's host DOT harvested 270 points built on championships in Men's Basketball, Women's Volleyball, Women's Single Table Tennis, and Table Tennis Mixed Doubles with bridesmaids finish at Badminton, Chess, Darts, Men's Single Table Tennis, and Women's Swimming.

The DOT's Swimming Relay finished at the podium with bronze while placing 4th in Bowling and Track and Field Relay.

TIEZA finished second with 250 points after winning gold medals in Badminton, Bowling, Men's Swimming, and Swimming Relay and silver in Women's Volleyball.

The infrastructure arm also registered third-place finishes at Darts, Table Tennis Mixed, and all Track and Field events (100-meter dash men's and women's, and 8x400 mixed relay). TIEZA also bagged the maiden cheerdance championship, which is a non-scoring sport.

PRA completed the overall podium at third place with 220 points, highlighted by the Darts, Table Tennis Men's Singles, Track and Field Women's championships; Track and Field Men's and Swimming Men's second place finishes; Table Tennis Women's, Chess, and Women's volleyball third place finishes.

Intramuros Administration (215), National Parks Development Committee (185), Tourism Promotions Board Philippines (180), and Nayong Pilipino Foundation (120) completed the rankings in order.

Each championship is awarded 25 points, with silver receiving 20 points, bronze receiving 15 points, 10 points being awarded for 4th place onwards, and five points for non-entry. **DOT**

To celebrate the Department of Tourism's (DOT) 50th founding anniversary last May 11, officials of the Department led by Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco gathered tour guides and leaders of tour guide associations to a simple reception at the Casa Blanca in Intramuros, as a way to recognize the frontliners' efforts to champion Philippine tourism amid the pandemic and various challenges.

"Today we mark the 50 years of the Department of Tourism. And I felt it necessary to celebrate this day not only with the officials and employees of the Department of Tourism but, most importantly, with those that have been in the frontlines of tourism who have carried upon their shoulders the responsibility of campaigning for our country, of convincing our friends from all the world to keep coming back to our country, and who have by their example--by your example--shown us what it means to love the Philippines," Secretary Frasco said as she delivered her message at the lunch with tourism frontliners.

"I could not find it in my heart to celebrate it with anybody else other than our frontliners," she added.

Speaking before some 50 leaders of the Federation of Professional Tour Guides Association Inc. (TGFED), as well as NCR-based associations such as the Accredited Tourist Guides Services Cooperatives Inc. (ACTSCOOP), Fort Santiago Volunteer Tour Guides, Inc., GUIDES INC. (NCR Multi-Lingual Tour Guides Association, Japanese-Speaking Tour Guides Association (JASTA), Multi-Lingual Accredited Tour Guides Association of the Philippines (MULATGAP), and the Philippine Association of Accredited Tour Guide Lecturers, Inc. (PAATGLI), and tour guides, Secretary Frasco took the time to share her experiences as three term Mayor of Liloan in Cebu before her appointment as the country's DOT Chief.

Noting how her previous post allowed her to see first-hand how the tourism industry was devastated and deprived

by the pandemic, Secretary Frasco said, *"Therefore, it is a sense of urgency that I would like to bring to the Department, as well as a local perspective. One that always takes into consideration the welfare, the opinions, the concerns, of those who are on the ground and in the frontlines. Because I firmly believe that none of our tourism projects and plans can succeed if we are unable to translate into actual implementation by our tourism frontliners."*

To recall, the DOT initially organized a listening forum with tour guides and associations in March, where no less than Secretary Frasco underscoring the invaluable role that tourism frontliners such as tour guides play in the realization of the Department's endeavors, particularly in promoting the country's rich culture and heritage.

As she cited the country's recent global accolades, Secretary Frasco said it is incumbent upon the DOT to support those that continue to champion the Philippines, which include the tour guides, tour operators, travel agents, as well as each and every single component of the tourism value chain that contribute to the success of our industry.

As a token of appreciation for the tourism frontliners' dedication, Secretary Frasco personally gifted each of the attendees with goodie baskets filled with essentials that they may find useful in carrying out their duties as tour guides, including a lapel microphone, sunglasses, hat, and other accessories.

"Every time that you go out in the field and share the Filipino story, you help our Filipino families that are dependent on the tourism industry, you help in nation building, you help our country rise to its full potential. So I urge you, our dear tour guides, to continue to tell the good news about the Philippines, to continue to tell the Filipino story with love," Secretary Frasco enthused.

More than 43k workers receive DOT training on the Filipino Brand of Service Excellence

The Department of Tourism (DOT) has so far successfully trained a total of 43,813 individuals nationwide on the Filipino Brand of Service Excellence (FBSE), steadily closing in on its target of 100K trained individuals for 2023.

To recall, Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco had announced last year that for the first time, the Department of Tourism would be embarking on an aggressive tourism education and training campaign for 100,000 Filipino frontline tourism workers.

“We recognize that Filipino hospitality is one of the greatest strengths of Philippine Tourism that could enhance the overall tourist experience and strategically position the Philippines as a center for hospitality excellence in Asia. We are very happy to report that, through the combined hard work of the DOT Central and Regional Offices, our trainers, and all of our partners in the public and private sector who have exerted efforts to reach out to the workers in the entire tourism value chain, we are well on our way in achieving our goal of providing FBSE trainings to 100,000 workers. With this, we are able to banner Filipino hospitality excellence to both our domestic and international tourists,” said Tourism Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco, who earlier revealed the DOT’s goal during the national government’s Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2023-2028 Forum.

Region 4A (CALABARZON) delivered the highest number of FBSE trainees with 6,376, followed by Region 11 with 5,788, Region 3 with 5,783, Region 4B (MIMAROPA) with 3,920, and the National Capital Region (NCR) with 3,742.

The training recipients consists of the vast expanse of the tourism workforce including tourism professionals and members of Community-based Sustainable Tourism Organizations (CBTOs); representatives from the academe including teachers and students of tourism and hospitality programs; government personnel from national and local government units; Tourist-Oriented Police for Community Order and Protection (TOPCOPs); and those engaged in other tourism-related enterprises and services such as restaurants, retail, ticketing, transportation, pasalubong centers, among others.

Skills enhancement, employability for all

Upholding inclusivity in its training offerings, the DOT also ensures that its training programs are designed to provide all tourism frontliners, including persons with disabilities (PWDs), with a benchmark on how to render excellent services to tourists the Filipino way.

Last May 26-27, 2022, the DOT through its



MIMAROPA Office conducted the FBSE for Deaf Tourism Workers in Puerto Princesa City, primarily for employees of the Ka Inato Restaurant which employs PWDs—deaf individuals—as food servers and kitchen staff in their establishment since 2013.

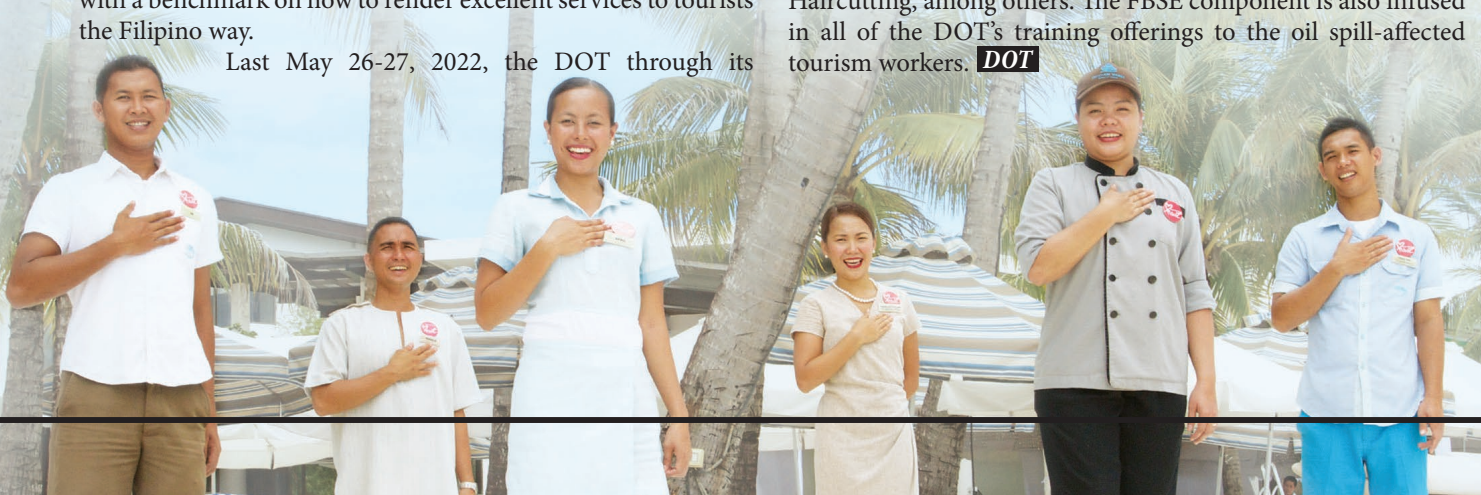
“We started helping the deaf community in 2013 because yung opportunity sa kanila nakita namin na wala talagang open job opportunity para sa kanila. So, ano kase ako nag serve ako sa Rotary Club dito sa Puerto Princesa and one of my projects is Hearing Screening and to find out na ang Palawan is one of the [highest in] hearing impaired persons in MIMAROPA,” Mr. Eric John Yayen, Ka Inato Restaurant Owner, said.

“Parang nabuhayan kasi sila, matagal silang [nawala] at the pandemic. So nung magkaroon ng training parang bumukas yung opportunity sa kanila, so nagpapasalamat talaga kami sa DOT,” he remarked.

Alternative livelihood trainings for oil spill-affected tourism workers

As part of its sustained efforts to assist tourism stakeholders in the various communities in Oriental Mindoro gravely affected by the oil spill incident in the waters off Naujan, the DOT also commenced alternative livelihood training programs for tourism workers in the province, successfully training some 270 individuals as of April 27.

Training topics include Farm Tourism - Urban Gardening, Tourism Micro Retail - Beadmaking, Food Tourism - Kulinarya Training, Health & Wellness Tourism - Hilot Training, and Basic Haircutting, among others. The FBSE component is also infused in all of the DOT’s training offerings to the oil spill-affected tourism workers. **DOT**





Medical Tourism pushed by Marcos Administration with strategic global partnership – DOT Chief

The Philippines is positioning the country as an emerging medical and wellness tourism destination in Asia with the Department of Tourism's (DOT) recent partnership with a global leader in the medical and wellness industry.

The tourism chief made the announcement last May 5 as the DOT formally inked an agreement with Dubai-based Agora Group, the "pioneer and leader in providing business solutions and productivity in the health and wellness tourism", to be a partner for the prestigious and high-level gathering of tourism stakeholders and medical professionals at the First International Health and Wellness Tourism Congress (IHWTC) 2023. The event is slated for June 8 to 9, 2023 in Dusseldorf, Germany.

The agreement was formalized by Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco and Agora Co-Founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Hadi Malaeb, at one of the country's leading medical facilities, The Medical City in Pasig.

In her remarks, the tourism chief emphasized that the event is a manifestation of how the DOT, under the Marcos Administration, conveys its "seriousness" in prioritizing medical tourism as a marketable product around the world. In a bid to strengthen the Philippines' position as a health and wellness tourism hub in Asia, as well as globally.

"We are giving the Philippines a fighting chance at becoming a tourism powerhouse in Asia. And we recognize that medical tourism and wellness tourism hold one of the keys to this endeavor, because we have the people, we have the facilities, and we are adjusting government policies to ensure that the climate for medical tourism to thrive will ensue," she said.

Philippines, a viable global destination for medical and wellness tourism

The Philippines' intent to sponsor the global congress is anchored on the current strategic position and potentials as a "serious regional contender." This, as the DOT is currently operating under the 7-point agenda embodied in the National Tourism Development Plan for 2023-2028, particularly, the diversification of product portfolio through multidimensional tourism, thus, the aggressive push for the development of a highly competitive health and wellness tourism product.

In fact, the Philippines has 23 health facilities internationally accredited and recognized by the International Society for Quality in Health Care (ISQua). In terms of ease of access to care, there are 63 private hospitals in close proximity to four international airports with almost no waiting time for appointments and treatment. These, apart from the Philippines' cost of treatments that are competitively lower compared to Western countries and other countries within Asia.

The Philippines is also one of the biggest English-speaking countries in the world where hospitals employ English-speaking healthcare workers and are mostly recognized by foreign insurance companies.

Secretary Frasco then emphasized that the partnership with Agora is a welcome development for the industry as it conveys great confidence in the potential of the Philippines as a next emerging medical health and wellness destination in Asia.

With the Philippines' natural wonders that have been recognized numerous times not only in Asia but in the global arena, the Secretary also added that traveling visitors can "heal after their procedure" on the beach, in the mountains, and they can also enjoy delicious Filipino food and the distinct brand of Filipino hospitality. In the case of medical tourism, the Philippines is also offering the signature Filipino "hilot" at various tourism-accredited resorts and spas in the country.

"We are also looking at our islands, including Boracay, as a potential destination for Filipino wellness as well as CALABARZON that have a host of wonderful offerings in terms of wellness," the tourism chief added.

She also puts emphasis on how special the Philippine medical healthcare workers are, primarily the Filipino diaspora.

"Everywhere that I've been in the world since becoming Secretary of Tourism and I say this all the time. I've always heard a positive story about a Filipino worker abroad and mostly it's about doctors, nurses, and caregivers, stories from foreigners who have felt the compassion, the care, the commitment to duty, and the willingness to go the extra mile to help those in need. That diaspora is very well replicated in all our medical personnel here in the Philippines, wherever you may find yourself in our over 7,000 islands and that is why we are very confident in pitching for the Philippines as the next emerging medical tourism and wellness destination in Asia," she said.

Further, she emphasized that under the Marcos Administration, the focus is to improve the essential pillars of tourism development such as the building of tourism infrastructure, enhancing connectivity, and digitalization of processes recognizing as well the need to further enhance the availability of medical tourism facilities across the country.

Apart from hard infrastructure, the DOT is also improving

soft infrastructure by embarking on an ambitious goal to train 100,000 tourism frontliners this year under its Filipino Brand of Service Excellence (FBSE) program.

More opportunities for PH tourism workers

In a media interview, Secretary Frasco expounded that the partnership with Dubai-based Agora Group for the International Health and Wellness Tourism Congress would also open massive opportunities for the country’s health and wellness offerings and to market the Philippines, especially from the most coveted Middle East tourist market.

Asked specifically how the Philippines will attract more visitors for this aspect as it competes with other countries like Saudi Arabia and Qatar with prime healthcare facilities, the tourism chief recognized that those countries already have the “wealth of medical facilities.” But she said what gives the Philippines an advantage is “the culture of care and compassion shown by Filipinos who are in these facilities give us the strategic advantage that people from the Middle East are already familiar with the level of care that Filipinos can give.”

Pursuing Medical Tourism

In 2004, President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo through Executive Order No. 372 identified service industries which the Philippines has the potential to be globally competitive which included health and wellness, among others.

In pursuit of the objective of the DOT to diversify its portfolio, Secretary Frasco underscored the potential of medical tourism in ensuring the growth of the Philippine tourism industry.

“When I first came into the fold of the department, one of the things that we discussed was how we can engage with our partners in the medical tourism and wellness sector. The towards that has been through collaboration with our medical tourism partners, our wellness providers, as well as our government agencies involved in ensuring that the policies that are in place to fashion this as a marketable product around the world are in such a manner that it would ensure the growth of this industry,” she added.

In its initial presentation to the DOT, Agora Group Dubai estimated the global health and wellness tourism to be worth \$45.5

to \$72 billion, with 14 to 16 million cross border patients and an average spend of \$3,800 to \$6,000 per visit.

International Health and Wellness Tourism Congress (IHWTC) 2023

The two-day IHWTC 2023 stands to be an important platform for promoting the health and wellness tourism offerings of the Philippines which is also a high-level closed-door gathering of tourism stakeholders mostly from the medical and wellness industry who will come only by invitation, and with an expectant 100 corporate buyers with a combined budget of \$2 billion.

“The signing of this partnership with Agora is one that we welcome with great hope and optimism knowing that it’s been in the pipeline for 20 years,” she said, adding that this would also open up massive opportunities for the country’s health and wellness offerings and to market the Philippines especially from the most coveted Middle East tourist market.

For his part, Malaeb expressed his gratitude to the DOT for sponsoring the global event, citing that he himself has expressed the world-renowned Filipino brand of hospitality.

“Thank you all for the effort and the welcoming of hospitality that I have witnessed since I arrived here. Huge thank you to the Department of Tourism for being the title sponsor of the event,” Malaeb said.

“I am very proud to be a partner of the Department of Tourism of the Philippines in order to promote the destination as a medical and wellness destination to some of the best and largest buyers of that product and service in the world,” he added.

The Medical City President and CEO Dr. Eugenio Jose Ramos also thanked both parties for choosing the hospital as the venue for such momentous event.

“It a pleasure and honor that you have chosen The Medical City as the institution that would sponsor this Memorandum of Agreement signing between the Philippines, through the Secretary and Mr. Hadi,” he said.

The event was also witnessed by DOT OIC-Undersecretary for Tourism Development Verna Buensuceso, Office of Product and Market Development (OPMD) Director Paulo Benito Tugbang, and Agora Group Philippine Representative Angel Bognot.

DOT vows support to SOCCSKSARGEN, Mindanao

Isulan, Sultan Kudarat - In a bid to further position the Philippines as a tourism powerhouse in Asia, the Department of Tourism (DOT) will prioritize the promotion of emerging and lesser-known destinations across the country and highlight the Filipino culture and identity, according to tourism chief Christina Garcia Frasco.

Addressing a crowd of some 200 guests composed of tourism stakeholders, local executives and officials, foreign retirees, expatriates, and diplomats attending the Bisita, Be My Guest grand launch in SOCCSKSARGEN (South Cotabato, Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, Sarangani, and General Santos City) last May 19, Secretary Frasco underscored the commitment of the DOT under the Marcos Administration to give equal opportunities for tourism development and promotion, which puts emphasis on providing opportunities to lesser-known destinations.

“Our President Ferdinand Bongbong Marcos, Jr. very early on articulated in his administration that tourism is a priority, recognizing the power that tourism holds as far as its ability to change the lives of our fellow Filipinos. No other industry is able to give such a great opportunity for economic advancement in the farthest places in our country other than tourism. The BBMG provides incentives to Filipinos, from overseas Filipino workers to overseas Filipinos, across all parts of the world. Based on the program mechanics, Filipinos will be the “Sponsors”, and the invited foreign nationals who will travel to the Philippines will be the “Invitees”.

Among the exciting prizes at stake are condominium units from Megaworld Corporation and SMDC, house and lot from Amaia Land, shopping perks from Rustan’s, and SM Supermalls.

Livelihood assistance

On the sidelines of her visit, Secretary Frasco turned over livelihood assistance amounting P200,000 to the Inugyunay Women’s Weavers Association, a community-based Tourism Organization (CBTO) in Sultan Kudarat.

The Inugyunay Women’s Weavers Association from Barangay New Passi, Tacurong City has created a sustainable and profitable business out of woven bags made of recycled plastic straps featuring hand-painted birds from their top tourist destination, the Baras Bird Sanctuary in Tacurong City, Sultan Kudarat.

Through livelihood assistance, the Inugyunay Women’s Weavers Association will be provided with high-speed sewing machines and other essentials for bag-making by the DOT-SOCCSKSARGEN.

The association is one of the three registered CBTO in Sultan Kudarat, which also include the Hinalaan River Guides in the town of Kalamansig, and the Katunggan River Guides Association in Lebak municipality, both of which had received livelihood assistance from the DOT last year. **DOT**

DOT, DND, DILG forge pact to make Mindanao a peaceful and viable tourist destination

Zamboanga City - In a historic move, the Department of Tourism (DOT), Department of National Defense (DND), and Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), have joined together for the first ever Mindanao Tourism Convergence to forge a collaboration in promoting the region as a peaceful and viable destination for domestic and international travelers.

In a ceremonial signing last May 31 at Zamboanga City, Tourism Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco, Defense Secretary Carlito Galvez, Jr., represented by Undersecretary Angelito De Leon, and Interior Secretary Benjamin "Benhur" Abalos, Jr., signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to strengthen inter-agency partnership by ensuring that peace, security, and order are prioritized in tourism development programs as part of the DOT's seven-point agenda, with a specific focus on Mindanao.

The event also served as the avenue to manifest the Departments' commitment to promote responsible tourism, preserve the diverse natural and cultural heritage, and create an inclusive environment that would further foster growth in Mindanao and the entire country under the current administration.

DOT Undersecretary Shahlimar Hofer Tamano, DND Assistant Secretary Henry Robinson, DILG Regional Director Paizal Abutazil, and Zamboanga City Mayor John Dalipe served as witnesses.

Delivering her message at the MOA signing event, Secretary Frasco thus underscored the crucial efforts to create an environment that fosters equal tourism opportunities for all regions, particularly in certain areas in the Philippines such as Mindanao, which may not have received much opportunities for tourism development in the past due to challenges brought about by untoward incidents.

To recall, no less than President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr. described Mindanao as the country's "Land of Promise" and also called on to "start fulfilling that promise" in one of his speeches.

"At the beginning of the administration of President Ferdinand Bongbong Marcos Jr., he made very clear his intentions for the prioritization of tourism development in the Philippines, including and especially the reopening of Mindanao to tourism. As part of our commitment to the vision of our president, we have made strides towards the goal of fully reopening Mindanao to its tourism potential," the tourism chief said.

Secretary Frasco likewise emphasized that the time has finally come for Mindanao to be reintroduced to the world with its wonders, not only from natural resources but as well as its people, traditions, heritage assets, and culture.

"It is time to put to the fore the ethereal Mindanao beauty that has sometimes been relegated to the backburner, to highlight to the world its spectacular views, its wonderful and amazing culture as well as the warmth and love of the people of Mindanao. Time has come to fully promote your sites, your heritage, your culture, your people, and to reintroduce this region to the world."

"So, we signed this agreement today with high hopes and a firm resolve for us in the national government, to be able to deliver the necessary support from agencies of government to Mindanao

so that you will receive the opportunities for tourism development that you deserve," she added, announcing the DOT's plans at the same time to also invite foreign ambassadors to witness the majestic beauty of Mindanao to further the promotion.

Though not physically present at the Mindanao Tourism Convergence, Secretary Galvez has strongly forged the commitment of the DND for this momentous tourism undertaking.

"As we all know, Mindanao has a long history of being associated with violence, danger, and chaos. Terrorism has sought its ugly head and armed conflicts, not to mention the prevalence of crime, had sullied this promising area's reputation, but that is no longer the case. Through the National Tourism Development Plan or NTDP 2023 to 2028, and pursuant to the guidance of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., the Department of Tourism is set to establish a Philippine tourism anchored on Filipino culture, heritage and identity, which aims to be sustainable, resilient and competitive in order to transform the Philippines into a tourism powerhouse in Asia," the Defense Secretary said in a message that Undersecretary De Leon delivered.

"The NTDP captures what the Philippines have to offer to the world and signifies our relentless pursuit of leveling up the industry through a global tourism brand. As it is here in this mandate to protect the country against external and internal threats and to provide support for social and economic development, we fully embrace our commitment to this endeavor as security and peace are preconditions to national development. It is vital to place a premium on the safety of our tourists and the overall security of tourism activities across the country," he added.

For his part, Secretary Abalos emphasized the role of tourist police and local government units (LGUs) to make the region a safe and viable destination for all.

"Through this convergence, the DILG commits to ensuring that our local police are properly deployed in tourist destinations. I also call on our LGUs to formulate their own local tourism plans, engage civic organizations in your localities, to collaborate and work together with the LGUs and other NGOs (non-government organizations) in promoting tourism developmental projects. We envision a tourism industry led by Secretary Frasco, that would really bring progress to the rural areas and promote economic activity in the provinces," Secretary Abalos said.

"Ma'am, suportado po namin kayo. Parati akong nasa likod ninyo," he proudly addressed Secretary Frasco, and also noted that the agreement is not just a piece of paper but a demonstration of the DILG's "dedication and realization of the agencies' aspirations, values, and objectives".

Why Zamboanga City?

In an address, Secretary Abalos emphasized how misimpression of Mindanao affected the region for years as far as tourism is concerned.

The case in point—Zamboanga City.

Secretary Abalos noted that while the devastating 2013 Zamboanga Siege has greatly affected local tourism in the area, the situation is far different now.

"For the last six years, records will show zero cases of

bombings here in Zamboanga City, zero cases of kidnappings here in Zamboanga City,” the Interior Secretary said, adding that Zamboanga City Police was also chosen as the best police station in the entire country.

“So, this alone will destroy this misimpression. ‘Yon po ang kalaban natin, yung impresyon ng tao na hindi naman totoo, at ‘yon ang pagtutulungan nating lahat. Mindanao has so much to offer—resources, the culture, and most importantly, the people,” he added.

Zamboanga City Mayor Dalipe then also invited guests and would-be visitors to “take a leap and make Mindanao a shining example of the profound impact that tourism, socio-economic government and nation building can achieve.”

“We stand united in our belief in the transformative power of tourism. Tourism is not just about attracting visitors, it is a catalyst for socio economic growth and a pathway towards understanding and harmony among diverse communities,” he said in an address.

“As we put pen to paper, we symbolize our dedication to Mindanao’s peace, progress, and prosperity. Each stroke of pen signifies a step towards building a region that drives on the principles of inclusivity, sustainability, and shared opportunities,” he added.

How will the agencies work together?

As the DOT acknowledges the objectives outlined in the Republic Act No. 9593 or the Tourism Act of 2009 where the development of responsible tourism as a strategy for environmentally sustainable and community participatory tourism initiatives has been cited, the Department also aims to engage local communities, including indigenous peoples, in the preservation of both biophysical and cultural diversity.

Thus, the agreement among the three national government agencies shall set out the framework relative to the development of rural and insurgency-free communities and areas with tourism potential in the region, and other identified areas through the implementation of community-based tourism programs.

For its part, the DND will sustain the current peace and security programs of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) by providing evaluation and recommendations in the prospective areas for tourism development.

The DILG, on the other hand, will sustain programs to ensure peace and order in tourist destinations by deploying tourism police personnel and coordinating with LGUs to train police auxiliary forces for tourist security.

While the DOT shall be responsible for the development of tourism circuits, provide

tourism product development to emerging destinations as well as the provision of training intervention programs and livelihood assistance to tourism communities and workers.

Livelihood assistance for Mindanao CBTOs

Secretary Frasco also met with Mindanao Community-Based Tourism Organization (CBTO) members on the sidelines of the convergence meeting for a formal turnover of livelihood assistance worth P200,000 to the Sta. Cruz People’s Organization, the group managing Sta. Cruz Island, the famed protected area known to many as Zamboanga’s Pink Sand Beach.

“Nandito po kaming lahat nakikiisa sainyo sa pagbangon ng turismo sa Zamboanga Peninsula,” the Secretary said.

“Sana po sa pamamagitan ng project po na ito ay mas lumago pa yung inyong tourism destinations and your tourism offerings, knowing that additional boats can surely cater to the multitudes of tourists that are now visiting the island and trainings in terms of the Filipino brand of service excellence, can also elevate the quality of services that we give to our tourists,” she enthusiastically added.

She also handed tour guiding kits to some accredited tour guides in the province.

“Para din sa ating mga tour guides, napaka-importante po ng trabaho niyo kasi sa pamamagitan ng tour guiding, nabibigyan natin ng story yung ating mga tourist destinations. First Philippine Hop-On Hop-Off tours launched

Makati City - The first ever Philippine hop-on hop-off bus tours was launched by the Department of Tourism (DOT) as it gathered industry stakeholders for kick-off of the tours last May 28.

The Philippines Hop-On Hop-Off seeks to provide tourists—particularly group travelers and fully independent individual travelers (FITs)—with convenience and flexibility on when and how they will tour a destination through a seamless, contactless transport and tour booking system.

Delivering her speech at the Activity Area of Ayala Malls Glorietta, Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco noted that the bus tour's pilot launch in Makati marks an exciting time for the tourism industry, as the DOT aims to bring the project to other key destinations around the Philippines.

Upon full implementation of the Philippines Hop-On Hop-Off in Makati, tourists can take the bus in designated stops within the city to enjoy its best spots and activities following suggested itineraries curated by the DOT-NCR team per stop, with the option to avail of private and guided tours. The HOHO tour will cost around Php 1,000 per person.

The project, which takes inspiration from world-class hop-on hop-off buses in cities such as Abu Dhabi, Argentina, London, Madrid, New York, Singapore, among others, will feature a dedicated website with all essential information, a reloadable EMV-capable card, and to complete the tourist experience, a mobile app for booking tours, making cashless payments, GPS networked-bus arrival monitoring and video guides, as well as information on hotels, food, and tourism merchants.

For the purpose of giving a preview of the Makati Hub of the Philippines Hop-On Hop-Off, a curated tour commenced at Glorietta where Secretary Frasco together with other government and private sector officials led the ribbon-cutting and ceremonial toast.

The DOT Chief was joined by City of Makati officials led by First district Representative Romulo Peña Jr., Second district Representative Luis Campos, and Vice Mayor Monique Lagdameo, Head of International Relations Ms. Ichi Yabut, as well as DOT officials Undersecretary Shahlimar Hofer Tamano, OIC-Undersecretary Verna Buensuceso, Assistant Secretary Maria Rica Bueno, and DOT-NCR Director Sharlene Zabala-Batin.

Meanwhile, Rep. Peña referred to the project as “a terrific way to experience what NCR has to offer at your own leisure.”

“Makati, the business hub, is proud to be included in the initial launch of this project. We are happy, actually very

happy, to invite and welcome you all to visit and enjoy Makati, the premier city,” enthused the Congressman.

“I am particularly happy that the Secretary, the DOT, has chosen our city to be the take off point for the Hop-On Hop-Off project,” said Rep. Campos.

“We see this as an opportunity to open our cultural treasures not only to our local citizens, Makatizens, but also to the rest of the country and to the rest of the world,” he added.

Also in attendance were leaders of tourism stakeholder associations, Tourism Congress of the Philippines (TCP) President Bob Zozobrado, Philippine Tour Operators Association (PHILTOA) President Fe Ablang-Yu, Ayala Malls Head of Marketing and Communications Ms. Chrissy Roa, and Ms. Marinel Barquin Lee of Positive Exposure, the integrator for the Philippines HOHO bus project.

The curated tour next took the guests to the Washington Sycip Park for interactive demo by artists and health drinks, followed by a quick stop in Ayala Malls Circuit for Filipino snacks, Museo ng Makati for coffee culture presentation, museum tour, and entertainment by Makati performers. The tour ended in Poblacion for a street party featuring performances by local artists and culinary treats from Makati's top-rated restaurants and bars.

In 2022, the DOT recorded 5.3 million overnight tourists in NCR, with Makati City ranking third out of 17 LGUs with the highest number of overnight arrivals at 969,927 visitors, after Pasay and Parañaque which took the first and second spots, respectively.

Meanwhile, preparations are already underway for the launch of the Philippines HOHO project in the cultural hub of Manila next. Both the Makati and Manila Hubs of the Philippines Hop-On Hop-Off program will become fully operational after the grand launch slated some time in June this year. **DOT**
